WHAT TO EXPECT AT HORSE CAMP

If your camper is registered for **Horseback Adventures, Horseback Explorers, Crafting and Horseback Adventures or Crafting and Horseback Explorers**, they will spend a three-hour block of time at the barn each day (either from 9:30-12:30 or from 2:00-5:00). During that time, they will have a group mounted riding lesson (approximately 1.5 hours) in either English or Western tack. The lessons will be geared towards their current riding level, and they will be matched with other riders at their level. Depending on their riding level, campers may work on anything from beginning riding skills to learning to trot to jumping a course or practicing a barrel pattern. On Wednesday, all campers will take a long trail ride during their barn time. During their time at the barn each day, campers will also participate in a ground lesson which may include such topics as veterinary care, parts of a saddle, parts of a horse, designing an obstacle course or other horse related subjects. After dinner, campers will return to the barn for a one-and-a-half-hour session where they will help with evening horse chores and then enjoy an interactive presentation from a local horse professional such as a vet, farrier, or horse trainer. When not at the barn, horse campers will enjoy other camp activities such as Bible Study, swimming, boating, and fishing at the lake. Campers registered for Crafting and Horseback Adventures will spend 1.5 hours each day learning new creative arts skills such as woodburning, leatherworking and tie dying a saddle pad for their horse. On Wednesday night (weather dependent), campers will have a sleepout at the barn.

If your child is registered for **Extreme Horse Camp**, they will spend all day, every day at the barn. Your camper will arrive at the barn after breakfast where they will help with AM horse chores and spend the morning in their first riding lesson of the day (approximately 1.5 hours). After a cookout lunch or sack lunch at the barn, your camper will take rest time and enjoy Bible Study in a hammock near their horses. In the afternoon, they will have a second riding lesson on a different horse (approximately 1.5 hours). When not on a horse, your camper will learn ground skills such as lunging a horse, basic horse first aid, how to take a horse through an "in-hand" obstacle course and how to make rhythm beads for their horse. There will be fun mounted and unmounted water games with the horses. Evenings will be spent helping with evening horse chores and learning from a local horse professional. On Wednesday night (weather dependent), campers will have a sleepout at the barn. Please note: Because this camp is so horse focused, your camper may not have time for other camp activities. We still ask that you pack a swimsuit as campers love lake time, but your camper will likely not go swimming every day.

If your child is registered for Extreme Trail Camp, they will be focused on trail riding. Camp will begin with a lesson in the arena on the first night to ensure your child is comfortable on their horse. After dinner there will be a sunset trail ride. The next day, your camper will be at the barn right after breakfast to pack for their overnight trail rides. They will enjoy a morning ride with Bible Study and a sack lunch on the trail. In the afternoon, campers will get ready for their overnight night. Once packed up, they will head to the Lutheranch Horse Camp site, where they will set up camp for
